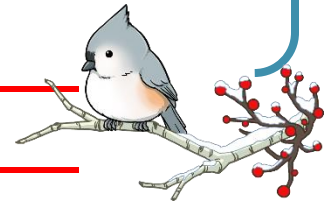

## MAYFIELD WOMEN'S CLUB ACCOMPLISHMENTS--JAN-DEC 2024

✚ School Supplies given to Foster Children. The value was \$1,200.00. The supplies were: pens, pencils, crayons, rulers, markers, glue and glue sticks, calendars, spiral notebooks, loose leaf paper, backpack, Kleenex, and construction paper.

✚ Items for Villa Serena with a value of \$1,200.00. They are: 525 Greeting cards, including Christmas cards and 52 Calendars.

✚ Items for "The Way" with a value of \$145.00: 26 pairs of socks, 11 calendars, 9 containers of cookies, body wash, foaming hand soap, bath scrubbers, hand cream, 3 pounds of Hershey Kisses, 8 filled treat bags. Lip balms and 17 scarves.

✚ 5,550 Medication vials for Matthew 25: Ministries.

✚ For Our Savior Lutheran Church Food Bank we contributed \$400.00 worth of canned and dried food items.

✚ Items for the Mitten Tree that were worth \$400.00 were: 62 hats, 9 scarves, 7 pairs of caps and mittens, 57 pairs of socks, 54 pairs of mittens/gloves, 6 pairs of mittens and caps, 19 pairs of baby mittens, and head bands.

✚ Items for Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital were stuffed animals, children's books and books with accompanying stuffed animals.

✚ There were also the Sweet Treats that we baked for the raffle at the Holiday Party with a raffle income of \$400.00.

✚ All the collected items we assembled and distributed were in coordination with GFWC. When the Annual Report is assembled, they are all put under different headings. An example was the giving of the 180 reusable bags that we gave to the Our Savior Lutheran Church Food Bank were submitted under the Civic Engagement Heading, but they could have gone in under Environment. It all depends on which areas seem to fit the collection.

✚ The School Supplies were listed under the Advocates for Children, while the collections for Villa Serena and The Way went in under Environment and the collection of the medication vials along with the collection of stuffed animals and children's books for the Ronald McDonald House Hospital Room went under Health and Wellness.
