# Hanukkah

Hanukkah, also known as Chanukah or the Festival of Lights, is a Jewish festival that lasts for eight days. In the Hebrew calendar, Hanukkah starts on the 25th of Kislev, which corresponds to the time frame between late November and December in the <u>Gregorian Calendar</u>. In 2022, the first day of Hanukkah begins at sundown on Sunday, December 18, and the festival ends at sundown on Monday, December 26. This holiday commemorated the Maccabean Revolt when Jews fought against their oppressors during the second century B.C.

Hanukkah is celebrated in several ways. In addition to lighting each day one candle on the menorah, religious rituals can include **daily reading of Scripture**, **recitation of some of the Psalms**, **almsgiving**, **and singing of a special hymn**.





# **Christmas Day**

Christmas Day in the United States will be celebrated **on Sunday, December 25**. Christmas is a religious, cultural, and commercial holiday, a day when most Americans spend time with family and friends, exchanging gifts and sharing meals. Christmas is an annual festival commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ, observed primarily on December 25 as a religious and cultural celebration among billions of people around the world.
