


#### **Home Life**

- Sep 07 Labor Day Labor Day is celebrated on the first Monday in September. It's a day dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. The holiday tributes the working class contributions to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country. Labor Day became an official national holiday in 1894.
- Sep 08 International Literacy Day September 8 was proclaimed International Literacy Day by <u>UNESCO</u> on November 17, 1965. Its aim is to highlight the importance of <u>literacy</u> to individuals, communities and societies. One in five adults is still not literate and two-thirds of them are women.
- Sep 11 **Patriot Day** Patriot Day is observed on September 11<sup>th</sup> in memory of the 2,993 people who lost their lives in the September 11, 2001 attacks on the United States. Americans observe a moment of silence beginning at 8:46am EST the time of the first plane crash in a tower on September 11, 2001.
- Sep 13 National Grandparents Day Grandparent's Day is celebrated in September, on the first Sunday following Labor Day. Founded by Marian McQuade, her primary purpose was to celebrate and honor the lonely elderly in nursing homes. She also hoped to encourage grandchildren to inherit the wisdom and heritage from their grandparents. In 1978, President Jimmy Carter made it a national holiday.
- Sep 17 Constitution Day | Citizenship Day Constitution Day and Citizenship
  Day commemorate the formation and signing of the U.S. Constitution and
  recognize all who have become citizens by being born in the US or by
  naturalization. It is observed on September 17, the day the U.S. Constitutional
  Convention signed the Constitution in 1787.
- Sep 23 Autumn Equinox First Day of Autumn
- Sep 23 **Yom Kippur** also known as **Day of Atonement**, is the holiest day of the year for the <u>Jewish people</u>. Its central themes are <u>atonement</u> and <u>repentance</u>. Jewish people traditionally observe this holy day with an approximate 25-hour period of <u>fasting</u> and intensive <u>prayer</u>, often spending most of the day in synagogue services.

 Sep 29 World Heart Day – This day is meant as a chance for people across the globe to take part in the world's biggest intervention against cardiovascular disease

#### Social Committee:

Our first Social of this Club year will be on Thursday, September 24<sup>th</sup> to Public Square in Cleveland. Quick details of the trip: We will meet at 9AM at the Mayfield Village Civic Center parking lot and car pool to the Green Rd Rapid Station for a trip to the Terminal Tower while observing many sights during the ride. Upon arrival, exit to Public Square and see the construction progress transforming Public Square. Bring your camera for many un-obstructive views of Cleveland's skyscrapers! Then board a free loop bus from Public Square on Euclid Ave to E 9<sup>th</sup> Street and arrive at the new Heinen's, located in the former Cleveland Trust Building. You will be amazed at the building transformation and the variety of foods. Once again on the free loop bus to view more Cleveland buildings, Playhouse Square and the Gateway Arches. Time permitting we will exit for a closer view of Playhouse Square's outdoor chandelier.

Final trip on the free loop bus, return to Public Square and enter the Horseshoe Casino for their extraordinary all-you-can-eat buffet lunch. *Security may require a photo ID and purses may be checked.* If you have a Player's Card you receive a \$2 discount on the buffet or you may obtain a card there. A Player's Card is <u>not</u> necessary to dine there. After lunch we visit the Soldier and Sailors Monument across the street. Then we return to Terminal Tower and catch the Green Road Rapid back. Costs for this trip—Seniors pay\$1 each way for the rapid; Buffet lunch is \$18 or \$16 w/Player's Card. Any shopping or Casino play is up to you. The trip will be educational, enlightening and very fun. Several members signed up at the President's Picnic. A sign-up sheet will be at the September General Meeting for more to join.
