

Home Life

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Emotional, physical, and also financial aspects of a person's life are greatly affected. Words taken from our GFWC Manual: Domestic violence affects individuals in every community across the United States. It may include the use of physical and sexual violence, verbal and emotional abuse, stalking, and economic abuse. Domestic violence results in physical injury, psychological trauma, and sometimes death. The consequences of domestic violence can cross generations and last a lifetime. In 20 I 2, the GFWC created the GFWC Success for Survivors Scholarship to help those impacted by intimate partner violence that is pursuing higher education. The scholarship aims to provide survivors with a means to achieve both financial and personal independence. Since 20 I 2, GFWC has awarded \$50,000 in scholarship funds. The scholarships are awarded each .June. There is a campaign that symbolizes communities concerns in shedding light on the devastating effects of domestic violence and their unified commitment to make every home a safe home-The Light in the Window Campaign - it signifies community solidarity toward ending domestic violence across the state by displaying a purple-lit, electric candles in the windows of residences, businesses public buildings, schools/universities, hospitals, churches, etc. The GFWC State Chairman for Domestic Violence Awareness and Prevention is Lou Ann Swallie; 740-425-2571; swalliefam@sbcglobal.net;The LED District Chairman is Kathy Fink.


